A real artist

By Stan Cameron, musician and writer.

Everywhere you go these days, you can hear music: hip-hop, rock, soul, reggae, so many different kinds of music. My favourite kind of music is blues. I love the blues! Many people think it's sad and boring, but they're wrong. The greatest blues singer in the world was Muddy Waters. He was born in the little town of Rolling Rock, Mississippi in 1915, and he died in the American state of Illinois sixty-eight years later in 1983. When Muddy Waters was a boy, he had no money, but he loved music and he learned to play the guitar by himself. One day in 1941, while he was sitting playing his guitar, a man named Alan Lomax came to his house to listen to him. That was the day Muddy made his first recording. During the 1940s and 50s, Muddy lived and worked in Chicago. In this big city, he changed his style. He stopped playing country blues music and started to play 'urban' blues music - blues from the city! Now, while he was playing his guitar, other people in

his band were playing the drums. It was music that was strange and exciting all at the same time. From urban blues many new styles have developed. We have to say a big thank you to Muddy Waters for the rock and soul music that we listen to today.

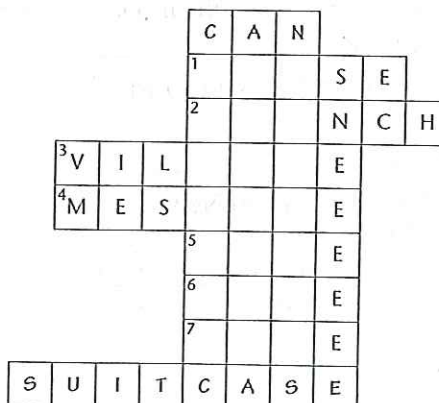

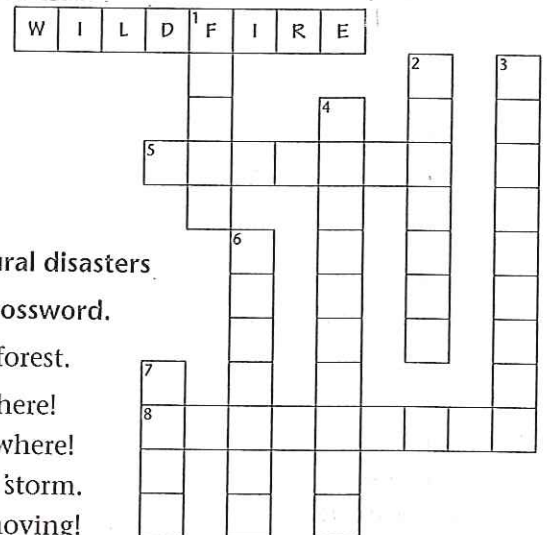

The moa-nalo

Few people have heard of the moa-nalo. This bird looked like a duck and it lived on many of the Hawaiian Islands in the Pacific Ocean. It arrived on the islands about 3.6 million years ago and it became extinct around 1000 AD. No one knew about these strange birds until the 1980s, when some of their bones were found on the island of Molokai. More bones were later found on Maui and O'ahu.

The moa-nalo was a strange bird and there were three or four different species. Moa-nalos weren't meat-eaters. They ate plants and leaves. All of these birds were very large. They weighed 4 to 7.5 kg, had big hard beaks, or 'noses', and small wings. Just like the dodo,

Families

One of the great things about our world is how people are so very different, but at the same time the same! Think about families for a minute. There are so many kinds of families, but they all do the same thing; they give children a safe place to grow up, so they become confident cheerful adults. Let's look at some different kinds of families.

In many countries in Europe – Greece, for example – there are still extended families. In these kinds of families, grandparents, aunts and uncles, parents and children all live together in one house. This is a good thing for two reasons. Firstly, grandma and grandpa can look after the young children while mum and dad are out at work. Secondly, the older people of the family are never lonely because they have lots of people who love them all around them.

In countries such as Canada, most people live in a nuclear family, which means that the parents and children live together, but not the grandparents or other relatives. In a nuclear family, the children must look after themselves more often than the children in an extended family and they are very independent. Of course, these children get along with their grandparents too, they just don't see them as often.

In China, there is only one child in each family. They have no brothers or sisters. These children are lucky because they get all their parents' and grandparents' attention. On the other hand, Chinese children are under a lot of pressure to do well because their families want them to be successful.

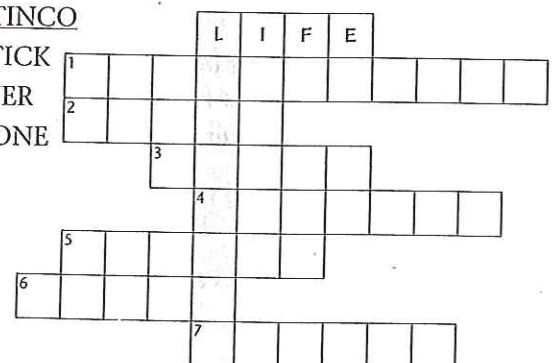

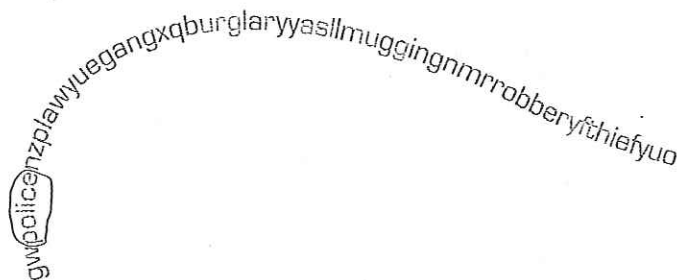
